Community Relations: Army provided an update on community relations actions:

- 1. Fort Ord BRAC public information opportunities will include participation in CSUMB, POM, and DMDC Earth Day events, as well as a guided walk in the Impact Area scheduled for May 17.
- 2. A Community Involvement Mobile Workshop has been rescheduled for August 23 on the subjects of Munitions Response, Prescribed Burns, and ESCA.
- 3. A Technical Review Committee meeting is scheduled for August 26 on the subjects of Munitions Response, Prescribed Burns, and ESCA.
- 4. The Army will staff a cleanup information booth are the Monterey County Fair August 29.

- 5. The Army provided a recommendation for streamlining the Information Repositories to accommodate the libraries' request to reduce shelf space used by the repository.
- 6. DTSC described the results of a recent meeting of the TASC.
- 7. BLM announced the current Fort Ord National Monument brochure will be reprinted with changes to reflect the status of Area B.

Property Transfer: The Army provided an update to current property transfer actions:

- 1. Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) 11: No change.
- 2. **FOST 12:** SPK-OC is reviewing Parcel E29b.3.1 deed and revising Parcel S2.1.2 deed for resubmission to UC. A conference call on 18 April between ELD, HQUSACE-OC, SPK-OC and BRAC-FO was held to resolve questions about HMP language in deeds.
- 3. Finding of Suitability for Early Transfer (FOSET) 4 CERCLA Warranty: No change.
- 4. Finding of Suitability for Early Transfer (FOSET) 5 Deed Amendment Corrections: No change.
- 5. Parcel L20.4 (Oil Well Rd) transfer to BLM: No change.

ESCA Update: ESCA provided a summary of Technical Progress and Public Participation.

- 1. ESCA worked with MRWPCA to develop a reimbursement agreement for access to portions of the Seaside ESCA properties for biological and topographical surveys ESCA provided UXO awareness training, escort and site security during access.
- 2. ESCA worked with MPWMD to develop a reimbursement agreement to expand the existing ASR well site on Seaside ESCA properties.
- 3. ESCA conducted community outreach at Sea Otter Classic.
- 4. ESCA participated in CSUMB Earth Day celebration with Army community outreach.
- 5. The BLM asked ESCA to consider how ownership of ESCA property will be messaged to the public. FORA stated the information provided to the communities consistently emphasize the use of the access corridors to access BLM properties through the ESCA properties and is being coordinated with the County of Monterey.
- 6. ESCA has submitted an ESS for MRS-28 to USATCES.
- 7. BLM asked if the fence surrounding the MOUT Site has been built, and how access from the MOUT site into the Impact Area is controlled. FORA responded that currently the MOUT site is limited to Army use only through the POM. POM users are notified of land use controls including access restrictions as part of their application/use review process. The MOUT site is scheduled to transfer to MPC once regulatory site closure has been received. Under existing agreements MPC will be required to build a fence before they can use the property. A Group 3 Land Use Control Implementation, Operation and Maintenance Plan will be developed after the Group 3 ROD is finalized and will address MOUT use issues to protect the public and the environment.

Fieldwork Update: The Army provided an update on recent and planned fieldwork:

- 1. Subsurface MEC removal in the WGBA portion of the 100 ft buffer is in progress. Subsurface removal work remains in the 100-ft buffer area within Units 2 (adjacent to Del Rey Oaks) where fencing must be moved.
- 2. Surface MEC removal in WGBA unburned portions north and south are in progress with a completion date estimate of May 20.
- 3. Surface removal in Unit 7 and Units 33 is complete. Surface MEC removal continues in Unit10 with an estimated completion date of May 29. DGM in these units is in progress.
- 4. The totals for UXO items found and MD (in pounds) processed in active remediation units/areas to date were provided by unit or work area.
- 5. A Blow-in-Place detonation of a 40mm grenade projectile was completed on March 27.
- 6. Data collection for annual surface monitoring of completed Track 3 surface MEC removal areas is complete. All items initially identified as MPPEH (Range 48) have been confirmed as MD.

MMRP Safety and Site Security: The Army provided a description of recent MEC and trespass incidents, community education events and related training.

- 1. There was 1 MEC incident reported since the March meeting.
 - April 16 A BLM weed crew reported a missile body in Unit 21, HA 37 east in vicinity of Riso Ridge Road. A MEC safety contractor responded and determined the item to be a projectile, 3.5 inch, rocket, practice, expended. The item was transported to the MD bin for recycle.
- 2. There were no Evidence of Trespass reports since the March meeting.
- 3. The Army provided a status of MEC safety training program. Recent participants included construction contractors for development projects.
- 4. An annual meeting of was held on 13 February. A summary of the Munitions Response Site Security Committee annual meeting has been drafted and provided to committee members for review and comment.

Remaining RI/FS Areas: The Army provided an update on the status of the development of an RI/FS for the MRSs and adjoining property outside the impact area.

- 1. Track 2 RI/FS report for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft final, will be issued 23 May.
- 2. DTSC requested clarification of the process for characterization of MRS-16 saturated area. The Army provided clarification in its responses to DTSC comments, and requested agency review.

MRS-34 (**FAAF**): The draft final ROD was issued January 31. The review period ends April 30. The impact of the formal dispute process concerning the Group 3 ROD on the MRS-34 document schedule was discussed.

Report Status: The Army provided a review and update:

1. The FFA schedule for the Track 3 program will be updated.

- 2. MRS-BLM Non-Burn Fuelbreaks TIP, draft The publication date is to be determined.
- 3. MRS-BLM Non-Burn 100ft Buffer South of BLM Headquarters (HQ) Draft Final TIP, draft final is planned of issue on May 23.
- 4. MRS-BLM Units 4, 11 and 12 (2011 Units), draft Comments have been received from EPA and DTSC. The draft final version is scheduled for publication on May 15.
- 5. MRS-BLM Unit 6 TM The document was issued on February 27. Agency review is complete. The Army will address comments.
- 6. MRS Units 7 and 10 (2013 units) After Action Report, Draft was issued on March 21. Comments are due by April 29.
- 7. Track 2 ROD MRS-34 (FAAF), draft final was issued 31 January. Comments have been received from the EPA. The review period ends 30 April.
- 8. Track 2 RI/FS for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft final is planned for issue on May 23. Comments have been received from EPA, DTSC, CAG, and BLM.

FFA Schedule: The Army provided a review of the FFA schedule. The comment period for the publication of the draft final MRS-BLM Units 4, 11, and 12 Remedial Action Report is changed to 15 May.

Action Items: Due action items were described as complete and pending items were reviewed.

The next meetings of the MR BCT were scheduled for May 16 at 10:00 A.M. and June 18 at 10:00 A.M. at the Fort Ord BRAC conference room.
