ESCA Update: ESCA provided a summary of Technical Progress and Public Participation.

- 1. ESCA is currently working on document development.
- 2. ESCA will participate in the Army's CIW and TRC in August.

Community Relations: Army provided an update on community relations actions:

- 1. A Community Involvement Mobile Workshop has been rescheduled for August 23 on the subjects of Munitions Response, Prescribed Burns, and ESCA. Community comments and suggestions will be documented via comment cards and through staff.
- 2. A Technical Review Committee meeting is scheduled for August 26 on the subjects of Munitions Response, Prescribed Burns, and ESCA.

- 3. The Army will staff a cleanup information booth are the Monterey County Fair August 29.
- 4. Fort Ord Annual Report highlighting 2013 cleanup actions has been posted on the Army's cleanup website, www.fortordcleanup.com. Printed copies will be distributed to the community. The Army will update general fact sheets on cleanup projects to be made available on the Army's cleanup website.

Property Transfer: The Army provided an update to current property transfer actions:

- 1. Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) 11: No change.
- 2. **FOST 12:** SPK-OC comments on the Parcel S2.1.2 deed will be addressed.
- 3. Finding of Suitability for Early Transfer (FOSET) 4 CERCLA Warranty: No change.
- 4. **Finding of Suitability for Early Transfer (FOSET) 5 Deed Amendment Corrections:** FORA transferred the properties to itself under the correct name. The corrections are complete.
- 5. Parcel L20.4 (Oil Well Rd) transfer to BLM: No change.

Fieldwork Update: The Army provided an update on recent and planned fieldwork:

- 1. Subsurface MEC removal in 100-ft buffer along South Boundary Road and Blueline Road, including the WGBA portion, is complete. Subsurface removal work in the 100-ft buffer area within Units 2 (adjacent to Del Rey Oaks) where fencing had to be moved, is complete. The fence has been re-placed.
- 2. Surface MEC removal in WGBA unburned portions north and south is complete, with DGM approximately 16% complete.
- 3. Surface removal in Unit 7, 10 and 33, is complete. DGM is complete in Units 7 and 33, and in progress in Unit 10.
- 4. Surface MEC removal is in progress in Unit 1. Vegetation cutting is in progress in Unit 2.

MMRP Safety and Site Security: The Army provided a description of recent MEC and trespass incidents, community education events and related training.

1. There was 1 MEC incident reported since the June meeting.

July 11 – An Army habitat restoration contractor reported a rocket motor in HA-44. USACE OE Safety Specialist responded and identified the item as an expended motor, rocket, 66mm incendiary. The item was transported to the MD bin for recycle.

Updated information was provided regarding two previously reported incidents within the ESCA project areas.

Vandenberg AFB EOD reported they did not respond to any MEC incidents in Fort Ord area during January-June 2014.

2. There were no Evidence of Trespass reports since the June meeting.

As a follow-up to a June graffiti incident in the MOUT site, patrols have been increased. The Army has begun investigating websites reportedly containing images or descriptions of the MOUT site indicating or advocating trespass.

3. The Army provided a status of MEC safety training program. An annual training of York School staff and students is scheduled for August 15.

Remaining RI/FS Areas: The Army provided an update on the status of the development of an RI/FS for the MRSs and adjoining property outside the impact area.

- 1. Track 2 RI/FS report for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft final, was issued in May. The Army will address comments received. The final version is expected in mid-August.
- 2. Track 2 Proposed Plan for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft, is planned for mid-August for 60 day review by the regulatory agencies.
- 3. BLM asked and BCT discussed the types of documents that would be issued for public review after the ROD is signed. RD/RA Work Plan would be developed to outline the remedy implementation approach, with possible additional site-specific plans. The Army would incorporate the Unified Federal Policy-Quality Assurance Project Plan (UFP-QAPP) format.

MRS-34 (FAAF): The ROD is on hold pending the Group 3 ROD dispute resolution.

Report Status: The Army provided a review and update:

- 1. MRS-BLM Non-Burn Fuelbreaks TIP, draft The publication date is to be determined.
- 2. MRS-BLM Non-Burn 100ft Buffer South of BLM Headquarters (HQ) Draft Final TIP was issued June 24. Public review period ends July 30.
- 3. MRS-BLM Units 4, 11 and 12 (2011 Units) Final version is expected to be issued by July 31.
- 4. MRS Units 7 and 10 (2013 units) After Action Report, draft final was issued May 28. The Army will address comments received from EPA and CAG. DTSC had no comment. The final version is expected mid-August.
- 5. Track 2 ROD MRS-34 (FAAF) The ROD is on hold.
- 6. Track 2 RI/FS for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft final was issued May 30. The Army will address comments received from EPA, BLM and CAG. DTSC had no comment. The final version is expected mid-August.
- 7. Track 2 Proposed Plan for BLM Area B and MRS-16, draft is expected in mid-August for agency review.

FFA Schedule: No update is required.

Action Items: Due action items were described as complete and pending items were reviewed.
