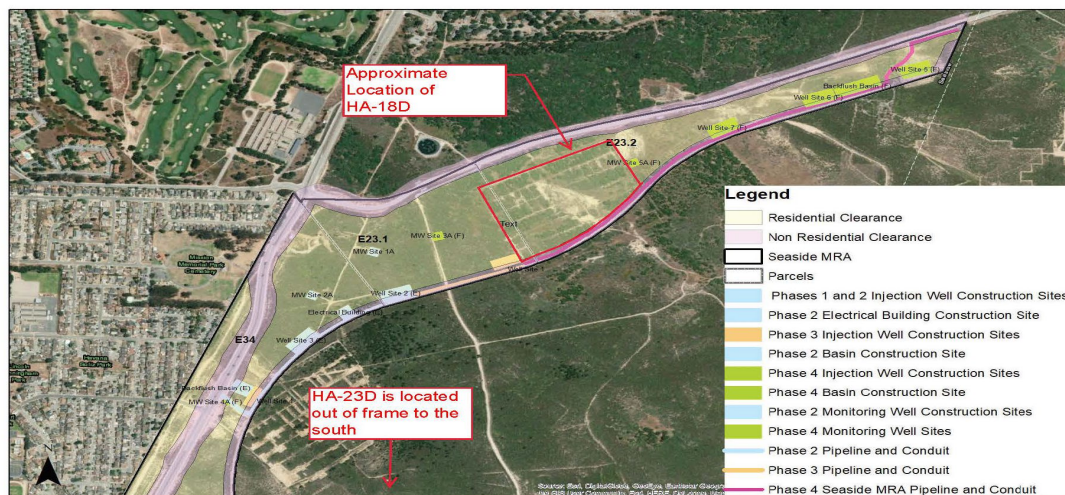

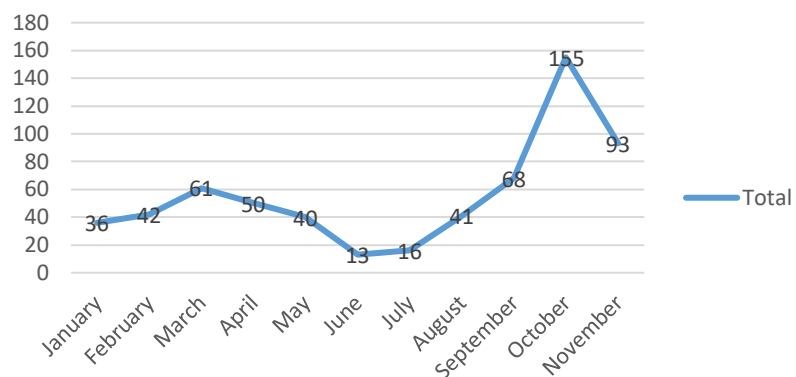

Report(s)

- On schedule: December submittal of Annual Land Use Control Report by Monterey County
- Construction Support Plan for portion of Phase 4 of the Pure Water Project to be conducted in the Parker Flats Munitions Response Area (see image below)
 - Project will disturb more than 10 cubic yards of soil in an area with a low probability of MEC, therefore on-call construction support is required.
 - The project will be conducted by excavating a trench approximately 10 feet deep, installing up to 20-inch diameter pipe and backfilling the soil. The pipeline will connect to the planned pipeline shown in the Pure Water Project Phases 3 and 4 project as shown in the Attachment A submittal, July 6, 2021 (See image on page 1)
 - On-call construction support Plan is drafted and being reviewed by the City of Seaside ESCA LTO office. Plan is based on the Land Use Covenant Implementation Plan LUCIP construction support template with project specific changes highlighted for an easier review.
 - Plan is expected to be delivered to Army, EPA and DTSC for review in early December.
 - This is a stand-alone document which will require BCT (Army, DTSC, USEPA) review.

Construction and Ground Disturbing

- Geotechnical boring activities planned in the Parker Flats Munitions Response Area related to the design of the Phase 4 Pure Water Monterey Groundwater Replenishment Project. Less than 10 cubic yards of soil to be disturbed in an area with low probability of MEC therefore, in accordance with the Land Use Covenant Implementation Plan no UXO Construction Support Plan is required.

Munitions Incident October 10, 2021

On October 10, 2021, a bicyclist reported a suspect munitions near Trail 65 and Eucalyptus Road on the former Fort Ord. This location in the southern portion of the Parker Flats Munitions Response Area (Phase I). BLM Ranger Peter Fonken responded and notified the Bomb Squad. The Monterey County Bomb Squad responded and removed the item for detonation.

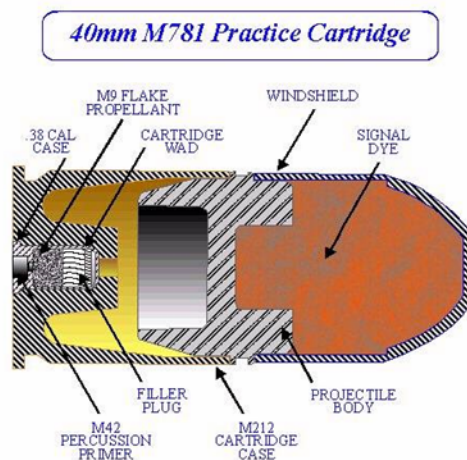
The Fort Ord Munitions Incident Form was prepared by the Army. The Monterey County Bomb Squad Call Out report was also provided to all interested parties. The UXO contractor for the City of Seaside as the FORA Successor-in-Interest reviewed the reports and concluded that the item is described as follows:

40mm M781 Practice Cartridge (Partial - Hollow Plastic Windshield and Signal Dye Removed)

Discarded Military Munitions (DMM)

Hazard Code 1

Below, left is a photo of the item found and below right is a diagram showing all of the components of an intact cartridge for reference.



This information and the Fort Ord Munitions Incident Form Monterey County Bomb Squad Call Out report were also forwarded to the property owner, Monterey Peninsula College with a reminder that this will need be included in next year's Annual Land Use Control Annual Report.
