

Fort Ord Munitions Response Site Security Program Update – 7/25/2025

1. Ongoing and Recent Actions

- Surveillance
 - POMPD and BLM Law Enforcement Impact Area Patrols (daily)
 - BRAC Site Inspections – approximately up to five times per week
 - Six motion-activated cameras at rotating locations since 5/28/2021
 - Adjustments to the independent camera system were made as needed
- Maintenance of Impact Area fence, signs and gates:
 - BLM perimeter fence inspection and repairs (weekly)
 - One large UXO sign to be updated (South Boundary Road near Laguna Seca)
 - Reinforced concertina wire in areas of trespass concern
 - Signage maintenance on Impact Area MRA perimeter fence
- Other Activities
 - The ongoing weekend closure of Parker Flats Gate started on 8/5/2022
 - Supported PG&E planned work and inspections in the Impact Area MRA as needed
 - Supported the Naval Postgraduate School with site visits to maintain the weather stations located in the Impact Area MRA
 - Held Law Enforcement Site Security Meeting for Prescribed Burn Operations on 7/10
 - Coordinated POMFD site visits into the Impact Area MRA for road familiarity
 - MRS Security Program Annual Report is under final review
