

FACTSHEET: What Happens Next 2017

The Army maintains an extensive community outreach program to keep the public informed about the cleanup activities at the former Fort Ord and provide opportunities for the public to participate in all stages of the cleanup process. The Army works in partnership with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, California Department of Toxic Substances Control, California Regional Water Quality Control Board and the Fort Ord Reuse Authority Environmental Services Cooperative Agreement Remediation Program to provide the community with information and documents for the entire cleanup.
