EXAMPLE FOR COMPLETING ITEM XIV (shown in line numbers X-1, X-2, X-3, and X-4 below) - A facility will treat and dispose of an estimated 900 pounds per year of chrome shavings from leather tanning and finishing operation. In addition, the facility will treat and dispose of three non-listed wastes. Two wastes are corrosive only and there will be an estimated 200 pounds per year of each waste. The other waste is corrosive and ignitable and there will be an estimated 100 pounds per year of that waste. Treatment will be in an incinerator and disposal will be in a landfill.

1. Original permit application listed 399,700 lbs. under D001. This quantity included amounts stored in underground storage tanks. These tanks were withdrawn from the ISD in 1984 and the quantity was reduced to 100,000 lbs. in 1990. The T04 entry has an explanation of recycling. Used oil was sold to a recycler at that time.
2. The original quantity requested under the 1980 permit application was 720 lbs. This quantity was increased to 5,000 lbs. in 1990.
3. These hazardous waste codes and quantities were included in the original permit application of 1980.
4. The additional hazardous waste codes and quantities were requested in 1990.
5. The additional hazardous waste codes and quantities were requested in 1992. These were newly assigned codes by EPA.
6. This hazardous waste code and quantity was included in the original permit application in 1980. Storage in tanks for this code probably included quantities in degreaser dip tanks. These tanks were removed in 1986 and 1987 and were replaced with hot water detergent degreaser units as part of the solvent elimination program.
