As described in Monterey County Code Title 15, Chapter 15.08, Section 15.08.140 (the Code), the U.S. Department of the Army (Army) prepares and maintains a Special Groundwater Protection Zones Map (the Map) to identify areas at or near the former Fort Ord overlying or adjacent to chemical of concern (COC) plumes (Prohibition Zone) and where groundwater extraction may impact or be impacted by the COC plumes (Consultation Zone). The Monterey County Department of Health uses the Map to determine whether proposed water wells are subject to Special Groundwater Protection Zone restrictions. The Map was last updated in 2005.

Per the Code, the Map was updated in June 2016 by the Fort Ord Base Realignment and Closure Team, which consists of representatives of the Army, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the California Department of Toxic Substances Control, and the Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board, to appropriately define the Special Groundwater Protection Zones with respect to current COC plume extents. A paper copy of the updated Map is enclosed along with a CD including a high-resolution electronic version of the Map.
