Environmental Cleanup Activities Treatment System Construction July – Sept 2015

Some shoppers and employees at The Dunes on Monterey Bay ("The Dunes") shopping center in Marina may see workers and construction equipment in the parking lot starting in July.

The Army will be installing a treatment system to collect and treat soil gas and groundwater. Typical equipment will include drilling and other heavy construction equipment, such as backhoes, forklifts and trucks. Photos of typical drilling equipment are shown below.





During drilling you may see some parking spaces or other small areas of the parking lot or sidewalk closed off with traffic cones or barricades to

allow for the safe operation of equipment, and to protect workers and the public. Additionally, there may be very brief periods of loud sounds from the drill rig. A map of the locations where the construction will occur is shown on the reverse side. Construction activities within 120 feet of a store front will be conducted after business hours and construction is expected to take 6 to 8 weeks.

Soil gas, also known as soil vapor, is the air found in the spaces between soil particles. The groundwater in this area is located about 70 feet below ground surface. Both the soil gas and the groundwater are contaminated with low levels of volatile chemicals. The groundwater is being actively cleaned up by the Army and construction of this new treatment system will also clean up soil gas. Safe work practices and air monitoring will be used to ensure there is no potential for exposure of contaminated soil gas to workers or members of the public during construction activities.


